

On Tuesday 325 women and guests arrived at the Leas Cliff Hall in Folkestone hoping for a day filled with information, entertainment, laughter and meeting up with some old friends, and they were not disappointed.

Carol Evans, the Federation Chairman opened the meeting by welcoming everyone, including the Mayor of Folkestone, Belinda Walker. After a rousing rendition of Jerusalem, Carol told the members that although sadly we have had to suspend 2 WIs we have formed 3 plus there are 2 more in the pipeline. Good news indeed.

Elizabeth Lansman, the Federation Treasurer, then talked through and explained the Federation Finances. She explained that both the Federation Office and the Trustees are trying very hard to cut costs but we still have a deficit although it has reduced slightly.

Our first speaker was Miriam Ellis from Catching Lives. Miriam gave a detailed talk on the work of the Canterbury based Charity which supports people who are sleeping rough and the hidden homeless in East Kent. A very moving talk.

The next speaker was Yolanda Barker from Singleton W.I. Yolanda gave us a moving and impactful talk on her Multiple sclerosis diagnosis and how she has lived and coped with the disease in her everyday life and how she has managed to live life to the full.

After lunch the guest speaker was Amanda Tooms. Amanda started her career as a professional dancer and teacher but went on to become a Councillor, a hypnotherapist and a psychotherapist. She shared some of her career highlights, transitions and poignant turning points. A very inspirational talk.

Carol then thanked everyone who had helped to make the day a success. The raffle was drawn and the National anthem sung

Treasurer's Chat

For those of you who missed our AGM or who weren't represented by a delegate can I remind you that the Federation has come to the end of our first-year banking with Lloyds and consequently now have to pay bank charges.

Electronic payments remain free ie no charge.

Any cheque of any amount paid into or out of our account is charged at £0.85p. Whilst this may not seem to be much we paid 168 cheques into our account just in March. I appreciate that a lot of invoices needed to be paid recently - tickets for the AGM, pooling of fares and insurance but those WIs who wrote one cheque to cover all three invoices cost us £0.85 instead of £2.55 saving us £1.70. Now I appreciate this doesn't seem much, but we have 100 WIs so bank charges soon mount up.

Please can we ask that you write on the back of the cheque which invoices it is covering and for what eg. Literary Lunch Invoice # 6666 £15, Spring Garden Day invoice #7676 £14, Treasurer Training Invoice #8777 £10 total £39. Not only do we save money, but we save precious time as each cheque has to be recorded and paid into the bank. If we all do our bit we can help keep costs down.

We have been asked about the use of card machines for taking subscriptions. Firstly, check the terms and conditions of your provider – some specifically state that they cannot process subscriptions. As charges will be incurred WI members must be asked if they consider this to be a legitimate use of funds and vote whether to go ahead. If members agree the charges are recorded as bank charges. Of course, the easiest way is for members to pay direct into the WI bank account but for those who prefer not to do online banking card payments work well, saving the treasurer time.
