# **UPDATING WI RECORDS & GDPR**

As we enter a new WI year it is time to think about updating WI records. It is important to make sure that the following items are done:

- All new committee members should complete a Trustee Declaration Form which must be kept until they leave the committee when it should be returned to them.
- All members should be asked to complete a Photography and Video Consent form when they join the WI, and it is a good idea to confirm their agreement annually.
- If photos are taken during a meeting or event members should be notified of this and reminded that they can opt out if they wish. No photographs should be published without members' consent.
- The WI email distribution list is the property of the WI and must be used solely for WI business; all members email addresses must be Bcc'd blind copied so that they cannot be seen by anybody else.

We had a great time going round the Theatre and exhibition.

The director Jenny gave us a guided tour and we learnt lots of new things about the Isle of Sheppy and Bluetown in particular.

From its aviation history to its WWI involvement. Why it's called Bluetown. The scorpion's and the docks and so much

more. After the visit we had a cuppa and cake and chat in the cafe. It was well worth a visit.



At **Wingham WI's** March meeting James Lang, a Kent Immediate Emergency Care Trainer demonstrated how 'Bystanders can be Lifesavers' Although an important message, taken seriously, there was much laughter and fun whilst resuscitating Annie. At the end of the evening all members agreed they felt more confident about using a defibrillator if necessary.



In March **Woodchurch WI** celebrated its 98<sup>th</sup> birthday with cake and wine plus

Kristina Boulden talking about her farming life and the products made from the fleece of their indigenous local Romney Marsh sheep. These sheep have been on the Marsh since the 13<sup>th</sup> century and are dual purpose, providing salt marsh lamb and creamy



lustrous wool. The benefits of wool include its being natural and renewable; it is fire retardant, durable and an insulator.

The 3,000 acre mixed farm has been in Kristina's husband Paul's family for at least six generations, but in 2008 they diversified and created Romney Marsh Wools, a collection of handcrafted woven items and lanolin based toiletries. They breed Romney sheep plus Merino; the latter providing hues such as grey and brown. It takes at least six months for the fleece to be turned into their vast range of products. Members were shown different types of fleece and heard about the size of fibres being measured in microns and the process from shearing, washing, carding, spinning to finally weaving.

When **Capel-le-Ferne WI** held its recent Annual General Meeting, "long membership" certificates were given to those members who had been WI members for more than 50 years – Diane Waters, Joy Walker, Patricia Roberts and Ros Chandler – and Jean Bell who has been a member for over 60 years. Jean tells of how when she joined you had to be sponsored and go before the committee prior to becoming a member. Back in 1962 when Jean joined there were over 100 members. It was an evening out for the ladies who took delight in leaving their husbands to look after the children! She never missed a meeting. They often went on evening visits including one to the Shepherd Neame Brewery who gave them a conducted tour after working hours. This was followed by a chip
