### Handy hints for secretaries storing minutes.

When you write your minutes can you make sure you write the year on them along with the date. It's easy when we are writing them to assume it's obvious but when some poor soul from Federation is archiving them years later it makes things very tricky.

On the front of your record books ( available from MyWI) can you please make sure you write the name of your WI and the dates of the minutes within the book.

I like many people used to print off the minutes, put them in plastic folders then put them into a ring binder. However the best way to store safely is to stick them into a record book. They can't get out of order or lost that way. It seems a bit backwards but sometimes as we ladies know the old ways are the best way!

### HELPFUL HINTS FOR WIS

#### Payments

If you're making a payment to East Kent Federation, please don't forget to let Alison or Lin know what the payment is for and which WI it comes from. If you're paying by cheque, please use DARK ink, ballpoint or fibre tip, write clearly with no alterations and make the cheque payable to EKFWI – CIO. These are the bank's requirements, and we must return cheques if they are not written correctly.

Initialled corrections are not accepted by the bank.

#### Have you got new members (trustees) on your committee?

Don't forget to update your bank signatories – it's best practice to have current trustees as signatories as they should be most up to date with committee plans when authorising payments/ counter-signing cheques.

#### Banks

We've all experienced difficulties with the banks at some point. Some WIs have been awarded compensation for the delay/frustration caused and this will usually be paid direct to the WI bank account. Remember, as a charity, individuals are not permitted to benefit from any compensation etc, it must remain in the WI bank account for use for charitable purposes.

#### Expenses

Committee members (trustees) are permitted to claim expenses incurred in their role eg mileage/parking when paying cheques/cash into the WI bank account, buying postage stamps etc. It is always best to mention this at your committee meeting so that everyone is aware. Any other purchases for WI should be agreed by the committee in advance of the purchase.

Have you got **new members** (trustees) on your committee? Don't forget to update your bank signatories – it's best practice to have current trustees as signatories as they should be most up-to-date with committee plans when authorising payments/counter-signing cheques.

#### Presidents

Your Treasurer should be asking you to check and sign off her bank reconciliation at least quarterly. If you don't receive this, please ask your Treasurer.

## PUBLIC AFFAIRS TEAM

Many of you asked to hear more about the work of Corine Dorard from the VAWG unit at Kent Police after she spoke at our AGM.

Corine is one of the Community Liaison Officers working in East Kent. Here is a short explanation of the work of the unit.

A Community Liaison Officer (CLO) working on violence against women and girls (VAWG) acts as a crucial bridge between vulnerable populations, law enforcement, and support services. Their primary responsibilities include establishing trust and rapport within the community, identifying at-risk individuals, and facilitating access to appropriate interventions. This often involves conducting outreach programs to raise awareness about VAWG, including different forms of abuse, available resources, and reporting mechanisms. The CLO also collaborates with local organisations, shelters, and advocacy groups to ensure a coordinated response to VAWG cases.

The work directly related to VAWG involves actively listening to and supporting survivors, ensuring their safety, and connecting them with counselling, legal aid, and safe housing options. CLOs may also assist with navigating the criminal justice system, providing emotional support during investigations and court proceedings. Furthermore, they play a proactive role in preventing VAWG by organising community workshops on healthy relationships, bystander intervention, and challenging harmful social norms that perpetuate violence. By fostering open communication and collaboration, the CLO contributes significantly to creating safer and more supportive communities for women and girls.

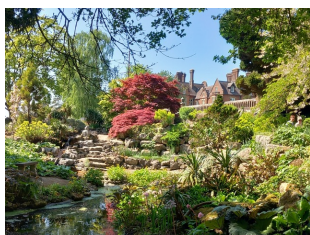
